Did you know there are still 5 million active land mines in Cambodia? Palm Springs residents Bill and Jill Morse traveled to Cambodia a few years ago in search of a landmine diffuser named Aki Ra who also runs a museum to show tourists what landmines look like as well as an orphanage for children who have been maimed by them. The Morses were so impressed by his work that they formed a private non-government organization, the Landmine Relief Fund, to support ongoing efforts and they have moved to Cambodia to oversee it. On Thursday, August 26 at 6:30 pm at the Tolerance Education Center in Rancho Mirage, Bill and Jill Morse will present a short 15 minute film and explain what is happening in Cambodia today. They will also introduce a young Cambodian woman who is visiting the United States for the first time and who will return to her home country in a month to form an all-woman landmine relief team targeted at rural low priority villages.
